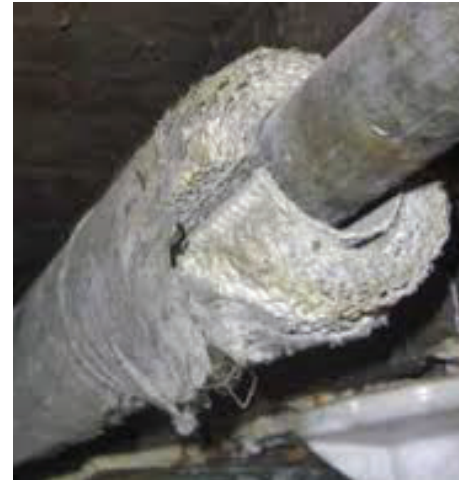
WHO TO CONTACT:

- If you have a concern please put in a maintenance request by calling 318-747-2723 24 hours a day or enter a work order online at www.barksdalefamilyhousing.com
- After hours, a call center will take the call and notify the on-call maintenance technician.
- You can also place a work order in person at our welcome center or contact your resident service specialist.
- Each work order will be treated as an emergency priority and have a work order number assigned to it.



ASBESTOS BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Housing built before 1980 is more likely to contain asbestos in various building materials, including pipe insulation, sheetrock and associated joint compound, flooring materials and associated mastics, and roofing materials.
- The presence of asbestos in a residence or structure is not a health concern unless it is disturbed or damaged such that fibers are released into the air.
- The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) typically does not recommend the removal of asbestos-containing materials that are in good condition and are not disturbed, damaged, or deteriorated. In place management programs are recommended if abatement of the materials is not planned.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR/KEEP IN MIND:

- Damaged materials in the home that are exposed to the living space such as wall or ceiling systems, insulation on piping, or flooring materials should be reported to maintenance.
- HMC personnel are not trained to complete abatement of asbestos containing materials. Abatement of asbestos containing material must be carried out by certified third party firms.
- Asbestos is generally only a health hazard if it is disturbed or damaged.

— DO'S & DON'TS FOR THE HOMEOWNER —

DO'S

- Do leave undamaged asbestos-containing materials alone.
- Do keep activities to a minimum in any areas having damaged material that may contain asbestos, including limiting children's access to any materials that may contain asbestos.
- Do take every precaution to avoid damaging asbestos-containing material.
- Do have removal and major repair done by people trained and qualified in handling asbestos. It is highly recommended that sampling and minor repair also be done by a trained and accredited asbestos professional.



DON'TS

- Don't dust, sweep, or vacuum debris that may contain asbestos.
- Don't saw, sand, scrape, or drill holes in asbestos-containing materials.
- Don't use abrasive pads or brushes on power strippers to strip wax from asbestos flooring. Never use a power stripper on flooring that may contain asbestos.
- Don't sand or try to level asbestos flooring or its backing. When asbestos flooring needs replacing install new floor covering over it, if possible.
- Don't track material that could contain asbestos through the house. If you cannot avoid walking through the area, have it cleaned with a wet mop. If the material is from a damaged area or if a large area must be cleaned, call an asbestos professional.

MEMORANDUM FOR DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Barksdale AFB Flag Display Policy Guidance

References: (a) SECDEF Memo, Public Display of Flags in the Department of Defense, 15 Jun 20

1. Flags are powerful symbols and are of particular importance to the military. We wear the American flag on our uniforms, place it in positions of honor throughout our base, and drape it over the coffins of our fallen Airmen and Guardians. As outlined by the Secretary of Defense's memo concerning the Public Display of Flags, *"The flags we fly must accord with the military imperatives of good order and discipline, treating all of our people with dignity and respect, and rejecting divisive symbols."*

2. I expect all Striker Airmen, Guardians, Veterans, Dependents, and Base Residents to abide by the direction in reference (a) and as expanded upon herein. This direction applies to work centers, common access areas, on-base residences, and all public areas. To ensure Barksdale AFB meets this direction, the following flag policy is effective until further notice:

a. In addition to the American flag, the following are authorized for display or depiction as representational flags to promote unity and esprit de corps:

- (1) Flags of U.S. States and Territories and the District of Columbia
- (2) Military Service flags including all Service Academies
- (3) Flag or General Officer flags
- (4) Presidentially-appointed, Senate-confirmed civilian flags
- (5) Senior Executive Service (SES) and Military Department-specific SES flags
- (6) The POW/MIA flag
- (7) Flags of other countries for which the U.S. is an ally or partner, or for official purposes
- (8) Flags of organizations in which the U.S. is a member (e.g., NATO)
- (9) Ceremonial, command, unit, and branch flags or guidons

b. No flags other than those listed above are authorized.

c. This guidance applies to public displays or depictions of flags by ***Service Members and Civilian Employees*** in all Department of Defense work places, common access areas, and public areas, including, but not limited to:

(1) Office buildings, facilities, aircraft, government vehicles, hangars, garages, ready rooms, conference rooms, individual offices, cubicles, storage rooms, tool and equipment rooms, workshops, break rooms, kitchens/galleys, recreational areas, commissaries, Air Force exchanges, and heads/latrines/restrooms—including property and buildings off installation leased by the Department

(2) Sensitive compartmented information facilities and other secure facilities

(3) Open-bay barracks, berthing areas, and common areas of barracks and bachelor quarters

(4) School houses and training facilities

d. This guidance applies to public displays or depictions of flags by ***all base housing residents*** in all spaces or items in public or plain view, including ***public-private venture housing (e.g., parking lots, yards, gazebos, or porches)***. All Hunt Military Community-managed units (*i.e.*, all government-provided housing on Barksdale AFB) are provided under a public-private venture housing agreement.

e. The public display or depiction of unauthorized flags in museum exhibits, state-issued license plates, grave sites, memorial markers, monuments, educational displays, historical displays, or works of art, where the nature of the display or depiction cannot reasonably be viewed as endorsement of the flag by the Department of Defense, is not prohibited.
